

Uploading Your Video

2026 Lyrical Flute International Championship

There are two parts to submitting your video; please follow both steps below.

Step 1: Upload your video to Dropbox

Use the Dropbox link on the entry form to upload your video file. Every entry must be uploaded to Dropbox.

Step 2: Upload your video to YouTube

Please also upload your video to YouTube as an unlisted video, and paste the link where requested on your entry form. A YouTube link is appreciated as it assists the judging. If you are able to include one, please follow the steps below.

1. Go to www.youtube.com
2. Make sure you are logged in. If you cannot see your account avatar in the upper right corner, click "Sign in" and enter your Google account details.
3. Click the Create button at the top of the screen, then choose "Upload video" from the drop-down menu.
4. On the video upload page, select "files to upload" and choose your video, or simply drag the video file onto the page.
5. You will need to wait while the video uploads. You can continue with the next steps while this happens.
6. Enter the title of the video: the name of your piece and the composer.
7. Enter the description of your video: played by (your first name), from (the book your piece comes from).
8. On the Audience panel, choose "No, it's not made for kids".
9. On the visibility panel, choose **UNLISTED**. This is important.
Do not choose "private", or the judges will not be able to view your video.
Do not choose "public", or your entry will be invalid. You are welcome to make your video public once the results have been announced.
10. Click Save or Publish.
11. Copy the video link, which appears under the video thumbnail, and paste it where requested on your entry form.

Your video must stay unlisted on YouTube, and please do not share it on social media, including private accounts, until the results are announced on 25 November 2026.

The Dropbox upload must be completed by all entrants, so please make sure you have finished Step 1. Please also complete Step 2 if you possibly can, as it is a great help to the judges.
